

Streetsboro, Ohio



This Northeast Ohio community, located in northwestern Portage County, has a

population of 12,311.

Within 15 miles, there is a total population of 568,974. Streetsboro is conveniently located approximately 16 miles northeast of Akron, 30 miles southeast of Cleveland and 40 miles west of Youngstown.



The history of Streetsboro dates back to 1798 when Titus Street received a deed from the Connecticut Western Reserve to land that would later bear his name. The first settlers came in 1822 followed by the establishment of the first school in 1826.

In 1972, Streetsboro became a charter city and incorporated the original 25 square mile township. The government is non-partisan with a mayor and a seven-member city council. In recent years the City has added new police and fire stations. The Streetsboro City Schools have grades Kindergarten through 12th grade. Private schooling is also available in Streetsboro and in surrounding communities.

Proximity to the Akron and Cleveland areas, direct access to Interstate 80 (Ohio Turnpike), I-480 and State Routes 303, 43 and 14 have greatly contributed to the rapid growth of manufacturing, distribution, commercial and residential development.

Residential, industrial and commercial growth is making Streetsboro one of the most active cities in the state.

Presently there are over 400 commercial and industrial businesses in Streetsboro.

A wide range of affordable housing is available including single or multi-family homes, cluster or condominiums, one story or 4 story apartments and a senior citizens apartment complex.

Both businesses and residents enjoy the benefits of quick access to the amenities of the region. The highway system allows residents to get to and from work easily. Local rail services are provided by the Wheeling & Erie Railway which connects to the Norfolk Southern and CSX Transportation. Cleveland Hopkins International Airport and Akron-Canton Regional Airport are both within a one hour drive. Locally, personal and corporate aircraft are served by Portage County and Kent State University Airports. The Port of Cleveland, which offers water shipping routes through the Great Lakes is also within a one-hour drive.

The Chamber of Commerce and local government are continually working to maintain a positive business climate in the community and quality services for businesses and residents alike.
